Prayer Before Reading Scripture

Leader: Let us pray.

All: Jesus Christ, our Master, You are the Way and the Truth and the life. Grant that we may learn the sublime knowledge of Your charity in the Spirit of St. Paul the Apostle and of the Catholic Church. Send Your Holy Spirit to teach us and remind us of what You have preached. We pray in Jesus' name. Amen

Scripture Reading: (1 Corinthians 12:4-11)

There are different kinds of spiritual gifts, but the same Spirit gives them. There are different ways of serving, but the same Lord is served. There are different abilities to perform service, but the same God gives ability to all for their particular service. The Spirit's presence is shown in some way in each person for the good of all. The Spirit gives one person a message full of wisdom, while to another person the same Spirit gives a message full of knowledge. One and the same Spirit gives faith to one person, while to another person he gives the power to heal. The Spirit gives one person the power to work miracles; to another, the gift of speaking God's message; and to yet another, the ability to tell the difference between gifts that come from the Spirit and those that do not. To one person he gives the ability to speak in strange tongues, and to another he gives the ability to explain what is said. But it is one and the same Spirit who does all this; as he wishes, he gives a different gift to each person.

Meditation: CHAPTER I - THE PRIESTHOOD IN THE MINISTRY OF THE CHURCH

The Lord Jesus, "whom the Father has sent into the world" (John 10:36) has made His whole Mystical Body a sharer in the anointing of the Spirit with which He Himself is anointed. (cf. Matt. 3:16) In Him all the faithful are made a holy and royal priesthood; they offer spiritual sacrifices to God through Jesus Christ, and they proclaim the perfections of Him who has called them out of darkness into His marvelous light. (cf. I Pet. 2:5) Therefore, there is no member who does not have a part in the mission of the whole Body; but each one ought to hallow Jesus in his heart, (cf. I Pet. 3:15) and in the spirit of prophecy bear witness to Jesus. (*Lumen Gentium*, 35)

The same Lord, however, has established ministers among His faithful to unite them together in one body in which, "not all the members have the same function" (Rom. 12:4). These ministers in the society of the faithful are able by the sacred power of orders to offer sacrifice and to forgive sins, and they perform their priestly office publicly for men in the name of Christ. Therefore, having sent the apostles just as He Himself had been sent by the Father, (*Lumen Gentium*, 22) Christ, through the apostles themselves, made their successors, the bishops, (*Lumen Gentium*, 22) sharers in His consecration and mission. The office of their ministry has been handed down, in a lesser degree indeed, to the priests. (ibid) Established in the order of the priesthood they can be co-workers of the episcopal order for the proper fulfillment of the apostolic mission entrusted to priests by Christ. (cf. Roman Pontifical "Ordination of a priest," preface) (*Presbyterorum Ordinis*, Decree on the Ministry and Life of Priests, #2)
