spiritually healthy to
proclaim God's love
and mercy.

Just as the sun and water nourish the wheat fields, flowers,

grass, and our vegetable gardens, so we need the spirit of Christ in us to grow. We need Jesus to enter our souls, or else we fade away.

As we celebrate the Eucharist in our parish communities or in our community houses, it is vital that we gather and receive him with an open heart. The gift of his Body and Blood is a high priority if we wish to remain with him and in him. How do we ground ourselves to believe in his promise that he is among us?

We receive Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. Jesus says, Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life. (John 6:54) To believe and trust in his words is a great leap of faith and trust. As we humble ourselves in receiving him under the elements of bread and wine, we partake of him in faith, and Jesus becomes part of us and for us to share with others. Jesus will transform our heart, mind, spirit, actions, and make us more like him.

We can also adore our Lord. It is an honour to listen to his voice at the daily Mass readings, while reciting the breviary, moments of silence in our day. In these instances, he pours his love and grace into us and we in return are renewed.

As we are fed, we are also strengthened to continue our service in our ministry. As we consume, listen,



and adore, then we are asked to pour unto others what Jesus freely gives to us. Catherine Doherty, founder of Madonna House, writes, we are to be a chalice of love ... we are to be a man to God ... and a reflection of God's love. Let us try to be a vessel of compassion, be it at home or on the streets

A greater challenge is to be Christ with those with whom we live. We can see and taste Christ in the Eucharist, how about the person who sits at our dinner table? Do we see Christ in him or her? Can we listen, respect, and forgive those with whom we may disagree or those by whom we feel we have been hurt?

As I drink from the chalice at the Eucharist, can I be a living chalice with my brothers in community? Let us pray that we renew our daily commitment to the spirit of the Bond of Charity, to listen, to forgive, and to respond to the call of discipleship.

MEETING OF CPPS MAJOR SUPERIORS 2023

THE MEETING OF MAJOR SUPERIORS of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood, hosted by the Latin American Province, was held in Chaclacayo, a district of the Lima Province in Perú, from September 18 to 22. The Provincial Director, Máximo

Mesia, was such a wonderful host who attended to every need possible. During the meetings, the General Curia drafted guidelines regarding Sexual Misconduct, a task which has taken one and a half years to prepare. These guidelines, approved by the MMS, are now to be implemented into each individual Province's policies.

On the third day of the assembly, a summary was given by **Father Alois**

Schlachter on the Formation Workshop, which was held in Rome, from September 1 to 5. Some positive comments and recommendations were made for future workshops. The following day was devoted to the Lay Associates: those who minister and share in our spirituality (USC, Associates, Friends, Sojourners, Companions, et al.) Also, a request from the Holy See, for there is a need to update the USC Regional Statutes.

The following day a discussion was held, and suggestions were put forward to hire for a full-time position for the Communications Office. This individual does not necessarily need to reside at the General Curia. More details are to follow. The Curia is sponsoring a Brothers Gathering in Chicago in October, for which an invitation for CPPS Brothers worldwide is being communicated.

And finally, a new agreement for the Funding of the General Curia. The Atlantic Province's portion allocates 8% for the 2024-2025 budget.

After the formal meetings, we had two days to visit our CPPS houses/

parishes, take in a mini tour of the city, and enjoy each other's friendship.

How do we apply each mystery in a practical way in our lives?

FIRST MYSTERY The Lord shed blood at the Circumcision.

We meditate on God's covenant as we seek purity and obedience to God's will.

WHAT A FORTUNE FOR US to use the short time we have here in this present pilgrimage for winning souls! What is needed there is for the Apostolate! Meditate often on the words: If anyone serves me, the Father will honour him. – St Gaspar, Letter 1915

SECOND MYSTERY

The Lord shed blood at the Mount of Olives.

We pray to overcome fear and loneliness and to be steadfast in our prayer.

THIRD MYSTERY

The Lord shed blood at the scourging. We meditate for patience and enduring injustices shown to us.

FOURTH MYSTERY

The Lord shed blood at the crowning with thorns.

We pray for dignity and endurance of misjudgment.

FIFTH MYSTERY

The Lord shed blood at the carrying of the Cross.

We pray and meditate for being grateful, to remain faithful and true to unfailing love.

SIXTH MYSTERY

The Lord shed blood at the Crucifixion.

We meditate for forgiveness and trust in abandonment.

SEVENTH MYSTERY The Lord shed blood and water at the piercing of his side.

We pray for an open heart towards each other, and the graces received in each sacrament.

As we meditate on these mysteries, let us ask for the grace to forgive others truly and fully so that His saving Blood will again move our hearts and touch the souls of our neighbours and thus obtain the joy and glory of our Father in Heaven.

SAINT GASPAR: A MODEL OF OBEDIENCE AND HUMILITY

EFLECTING ON SAINT GASPAR'S LIFE AND THE APOSTOLIC WORKS THAT HE UNDERTOOK,

Gaspar understood well that we are weak and limited human beings. And yet, we can learn from his example to humbly ask for the Spirit of Wisdom from God in prayer to guide our actions and thoughts. The rules and guidelines he wrote to accompany our Institute are proof of his wisdom and discerning spirit.

Another feature of Gaspar's missionary life that I admire was his apostolic zeal. His passion to continuously preach missions, his willingness to dedicate hours to hearing confessions, his caring, feeding and visiting the sick, and his attending to any unexpected issues that arose in various community houses by encouraging

obedience and love of the community are testament to his great love for the community and its members.

How is Saint Gaspar important in your own missionary life? His selfless love of God's people urged him on. Gaspar shows us the importance of humility and obedience. Listening to God's voice is the first step in being humble and then acting on what we hear through prayer. He urges us to have complete trust and obedience to the Will of God. Not my will, but your will be done. Relying upon God's grace, accepting each other in community, and living the rule can help



to guide each of us to be faithful to our charism as Saint Gaspar was in his own lifetime.
